UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

02 August 2021

1. We announce three hundred and fifty-five (355) new COVID-19 confirmed cases from one thousand four hundred and sixteen (1 416) results in the last twenty-four (24) hours, which represents 25% positivity ratio. The gender distribution is two hundred and seven (207) females and one hundred and eight (148) males. The age ranges from one (1) month to ninety- six (96) years. The new COVID-19 cases are distributed as follows:

- 2. We are reporting cases from all the regions, with Oshana region reporting the highest number of cases, accounting for 41%. Among the confirmed cases are sixty-one (61) learners, seventeen (17) teachers, six (6) students and nine (9) health care workers.
- 3. Of all confirmed cases, seventeen (17), representing 5% are reported to have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine and four (4) have received two (2) doses.
- 4. We have recorded one hundred and twenty-two (122) new recoveries.

5. We now have twenty thousand three hundred and sixty-five (20 365) active cases. Three hundred and eighty-seven (387) are hospitalized, of which seventy-five (75) are in Intensive Care Unit (ICU).

- 9. Oshakati district reported the highest number of deaths with twelve (12) deaths, followed by Windhoek and Onandjokwe districts with two (2) deaths each.
- 10. Of the reported deaths, four (4) from Oshakati occurred at home. There were two (2) maternal deaths from Onandjokwe.
- 11. All sixteen (16) deaths being reported today occurred in late July 2021: eight (8) occurred between 23-27 July, and eight (8) occurred between 29-31 July 2021.
- 12. By today, a total of **165 427** people has received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, while **49 554** have received two doses and regarded as fully vaccinated, as depicted in table 5 and 6 below:
