UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

06 May 2021

WINDHOEK *Check against Delivery We announce one hundred and thirty-seven (137) new COVID-19 confirmed cases identified from one thousand two hundred and fifty-one (1251) results received from the laboratories in the last twenty-four (24) hours, which represents 11% positivity ratio. The gender distribution of the reported cases is eighty-three (83) females and fifty-four (54) males. The age ranges from nine (9) days to eighty-eight (88) years. The new COVID-19 cases are geographically distributed as follows:

8. Key Messages
