
## REPUBLIC OF NAMIBIA

UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

1. Good afternoon fellow Namibians. We announce one hundred and fifty-three (153) new COVID-19 confirmed cases identified from one thousand three hundred and twenty-seven (1327) results received from the laboratories in the last twenty-four (24) hours, which represents 12% positivity rate. The gender distribution of the reported cases is eighty-three (83) females and seventy (70) males. The age range is from two (2) years to ninety-two (92) years. The new COVID-19 cases are geographically distributed as follows:

2. Among the confirmed cases are sixty-two (62) learners, of whom sixteen (16) are from Linus Shashipapo SSS in Nyangana district, thirteen (13) are from Okahandja SSS in Okahandja district, four (4) from Omafo SSS in Engela district and the rest are from different schools. Five teachers from different schools and ten (10) health care workers also tested positive for

## COVID-19 infection.

- **3.** Among the health care workers are five (5)cases are from Ons Tuiste old age home where seven (7) pensioners also tested positive to coronavirus infection.
- **4.** We have recorded one hundred and fifty-four (154) new recoveries. The recovery rate stands at 94%.

**5.** The total number of active cases currently stands at two thousand and sixty-five (2065). One hundred and forty-seven (147) are hospitalized, of which twenty-three (23) are in ICUs.

## 7. Key message

- It is critical to prioritize protection of the vulnerable populations (the elderly and adults with comorbidities), who are at high risk of developing severe COVID-19 outcomes such as hospitalization and death.
- The COVID-19 Ag-RDT and COVID-19 vaccine rollout is expected to be implemented soon in Namibia, which will enable tremendous progress in making rapid diagnosis of cases and preventing infection and spread of COVID-19 infection respectively.
- The elderly and adults with comorbidities are considered high priority groups for the
  vaccine inoculation and will be immunized in the initial phase of the program same as
  the frontline health care workers.
