UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

8 April 2021

WINDHOEK *Check against Delivery 1. We announce fifteen (15) new COVID-19 confirmed cases identified from one thousand four hundred and twenty-nine (1 429) results received from the laboratories in the last twenty-four (24) hours, which represents 1% positivity ratio. The gender distribution of the reported cases is eight (8) females and seven (7) males. The age range is from eight (8 years) to sixty-five (65) years. The new COVID-19 cases are geographically distributed as follows:

- 2. Today we record cases from three (3) regions. Among the confirmed cases are six (6) learners from different schools. Today's results reflect a good yield, looking at a positivity ratio of merely 1%. However, the situation may change tomorrow.
- **3.** We have recorded forty-eight (48) new recoveries.

4. The total number of active cases currently stands at one thousand one hundred and thirtytwo (1 132). Of these, one hundred and twenty (124) are hospitalized, of which twentytwo (22) are in critical care (ICUs). Nine (9) regions have hospitalized patients due to COVID-19.
