UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

18 April 2021

WINDHOEK

1. We announce one hundred and forty (140) new COVID-19 confirmed cases identified from one thousand and sixty-two (1 062) results received from the laboratories in the last twenty-four (24) hours, which represents 13% positivity ratio. The gender distribution of the reported cases is eighty-two (82) females and fifty-eight (58) males. The age ranges from five (5) years to eighty-one (81) years. The new COVID-19 cases are geographically distributed as follows:

8. Key Message
