UPDATE BY DR. KALUMBI SHANGULA, MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES ON COVID-19 IN NAMIBIA.

01 October 2021

1. We announce seventy-six (76) new COVID-19 confirmed cases from one thousand nine hundred and eighty-six (1 986) results in the last twenty-four (24) hours reporting cycle, which represents 3.8% positivity ratio. The sex distribution is forty-two (42) females and thirty-four (34) males. The age range is from seven (7) months to one hundred and one (101) years old. The new COVID-19 cases are geographically distributed as follows:

- 2. Of the confirmed cases, thirty-nine (39) are learners. Twenty (20) learners are from Ohangwena region representing 51% and they are distributed as follows: Engela district with eight (8) from Onyofi Combined School, six (6) from Okapombo Combined School and one (1) from Omutaku Combined School. Eenhana district with three (3) from Ohakafiya Combined School and Okongo district with two (2) from Ehafo Primary School.
- 3. Apart from Ohangwena region, Swakopmund district also reported five (5) learners from Coastal High School. The rest of learners are from different schools across the country.
- 4. Three (3) teachers from different schools, one (1) student and three (3) health care worker are also among today's confirmed cases.

- 5. One (1) case received one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, five (5) are fully vaccinated.
- 6. We have recorded eighty-eight (88) new recoveries from ten (10) regions:

7. The number of active cases is now one thousand one hundred and fifty(1 150). Seventy-nine (79) are hospitalized, of which fourteen (14) are in ICU. A total of six (6) hospitalized cases are vaccinated with the second dose of vaccines and none of the ICU cases is vaccinated.

- 8. We are reporting one (1) death from Mariental district. An eighty-two (82) year old female with co-morbidities who died at home on 14 September 2021. The deceased was not vaccinated.
- 9. By 30 September 2021, a total of **272 077** people have received one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, of which **15 776** have received the Janssen & Johnson vaccine, which is only administered as a one dose, while **174 454** had received two doses. Therefore, **190 230** have completed the vaccination, as depicted on tables 5 and 6 below.

11. **Key messages:**

- We have been observing a rise in cases over the last few days among learners as being reflected in case distribution. It is the rensponsibility of learners to exercise caution in preventing transmission as well as the COVID-19 taskforce in the respective schools to ensure that public health measures are closely observed.
- Parents and Guardians are also urged to ensure the children are observing the public health measures when going to school. Most affected learners are from Combined Schools.
- In addition, the public is highly encouraged to take vaccination seriously in order to build immunity against the virus and also reduce hospitalization due to severe illness and death. From today's statistics, all those who are in ICU are not vaccinated.
