

MEMO FOR ALL TRAVELLERS & VISA ON ARRIVAL ONLINE 90 DAY VALIDITY UPDATE

Windhoek, Namibia – [28 March 2025] – A follow-up call was made this morning by the Executive Director, Mr. Maritz, from the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety and Security. This pertains to the meeting held yesterday, 27 March 2025, with the Ministry of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety and Security, in collaboration with the Namibia Investment Promotion & Development Board (NIPDB), the Erongo Regional Tourism Forum, and Namibia's Tourism Private Sector, represented by the **Tour and Safari Association of Namibia (TASA)** and the Hospitality Association of Namibia (HAN) and other Stakeholders. The discussion focused on the 30-day online Visa on Arrival (VOA) validity period for international travelers, as well as provisions for those who have already obtained an Online E-Visa but require additional days.

The Executive Director, Mr. Maritz, shared this information, and we are excited to announce the update, encouraging eligible travelers and the industry to take advantage of the amendments.

Visa On Arrival

Apply up to 30 days of Visa on Arrival.

We are pleased to announce that Home Affairs has reviewed the validity period of 30 days for the online application submissions (E-Visa) and has approved to lift the validity days up to the official 90 days from the date of issue for Tourist Visas in a calendar year.

Additionally, the ED has confirmed that travelers who have obtained the 30-day Online E-Visa on Arrival since the launch and require additional days can request an extension upon arrival. To process this request, travelers must provide the necessary documents to Immigration officials for verification
