SIKERETE CAMP

KHAUDUM NATIONAL PARK

Namibia's remote no-nonsense Khaudum National Park is set to re-open Sikerete Camp to tourists on 1 July 2022. Officially closed since March 2019, and discouraged for use as far back as 2015 on account of its dilapidated state, the old campsites have received a much needed and refreshing revamp to bring them up to scratch.

The camp now also boasts a tented camp with eight (8) self catering units. The en-suite tented units each have a deck, field kitchen and private parking area. The units are furnished to a good standard.

The central guest area, slated for completion in May 2023, will afford guests all the important creature comforts one would normally associate with a world class safari experience such as the Khaudum.

The unfenced camps in the Khaudum keep up with the founding ethos best described by Dries Alberts, Warden, who tells the story -

"Khaudum National Park was established with conservation in mind and not for cash generation. This simple guiding characteristic gave birth to the true wilderness feel that embraces one's soul when visiting the park. It is wild, and we want to keep it like that."

At Khaudum, the conservation philosophy is embedded in the belief that the protection of wildlife and the support of rural communities goes hand in hand – the two tourist camps, Sikerete in the south, and Khaudum in the north, are privately operated in conjunction with the Khaudum North Complex Conservancy and the Griku Traditional Authority.
